Now she _____ (**begin**) to tremble. 'I'm sorry,' she explained, 'Mr James was also my boss. I work at his company as his accountant, and I know there was a reason for his suicide. The company _____ (**go**) bankrupt, and I feel responsible for this accident because I _____ (**give**) him the bad news, just this morning.'

The inspector looked at her but there was no sympathy in his eyes. He _____ (**say**), in a very cold voice, 'You are going to have to come down to police headquarters with me.'
